How To Register Your Child for Public School Choice

Registration Form Due July 17th

Stop by your child's Title I school to receive the parent information packet that contains additional information and a "public school choice" registration form. You may call your child's school to request a packet to be mailed to your home. The "public school choice" registration form is for **Option TWO** only. The registration form must be received by your child's Title I school by 4:00 PM on **Friday, July 17, 2009**.



If you choose Option Three, "Out-of-Area Assignment," an out-of-area form can be obtained from your zoned school. The form must be completed and approved to transfer your child to another school in the district (without transportation). If you choose Option Three, "Magnet, Millennium or Charter Schools," you may obtain an application form from these schools. Please understand that these options are limited to space availability. If you are interested in a McKay Scholarship, please call 633-1000 Ext. 505. Please call 633-1000 Ext. 528 if you are interested in home education.

If you choose Option Four, you do not have to do anything at this time. You will receive information regarding SES services and how to register after the start of the 2009-2010 school year.

Option One

Remain at the Title I school.

Option Two

Select to attend an assigned Brevard Public School that has not been designated for school improvement. Transportation is provided for students who select this option.

Option Three

Select from existing options as described in the District's Open Enrollment Plan. These options include:

- Out of Area Assignment (no transportation)
- Magnet Schools - Millennium Schools
- Charter Schools
- Home Education
- McKay Scholarships (ESE Students Only)

Option Four

Students who are eligible for free/reduced lunch may select Supplemental Educational Services (SES) provided by a state approved private provider. While every effort will be made to accommodate each request, federal law requires that priority for services be given to the lowest performing, lowest income students based on performance on statewide student assessments. It is unknown how many students can receive supplemental educational services until all applications are processed. There is no guarantee that SES services will be provided to every child whose parents apply.
