# Public School Choice Plan

## 2010-11 Parent Registration Information

Under the *No Child Left Behind* Act, the district must provide educational choices for all students who attend a Title I school identified as “in need of improvement” for not making adequate yearly progress (AYP) for two consecutive years. A school is determined to have made adequate yearly progress (AYP) if it receives a “yes” in each of the forty-five (45) academic achievement targets established by the Florida Department of Education. If a school receives just **one** “no” then it does not make AYP. Many of the best performing schools in Brevard County do not make AYP.

Parents who have children attending a Title I school that has not made AYP for two consecutive years **may remain at their zoned (home) Title I School OR choose from one of the other choice options** - attend a designated public school with transportation, choose from an array of choice programs available in the district, or keep their children at the current school to participate in district provided Supplemental Education Services (SES) if eligible.

### **STUDENTS MAY REMAIN AT THEIR ZONED (HOME) TITLE I SCHOOL OR SELECT ONE OF THE FOLLOWING CHOICES:**

#### **Option One**

Remain at the zoned (home) Title I school.

#### **Option Two**

Select to attend an assigned Brevard Public Choice School that has not been designated for school improvement (see list). Transportation is provided for students who select this option.

#### **Option Three**

Select from existing options as described in the district’s Open Enrollment Plan. These options include:

- Magnet Schools
- Home Education
- Millennium Schools
- Charter Schools
- Out of Area Assignment (no transportation)
- Brevard Virtual Instruction Program (BVIP)
- McKay Scholarships (ESE Students Only)

Parents are responsible for applying for an out-of-area assignment or registering for choices in Option Three.

#### **Option Four**

Families of students who are on free/reduced lunch are eligible for Supplemental Education Services (SES) with a state approved private provider.
